






A - Overview of bench



A collection of chunky outdoor furniture with built-in planters. The range consist of two different types of benches, tables and stools all set upon castor wheels to move them easy around your terrace.









B - Construction of bench



The entire collection is made from salvaged timber planks, but any good locally sourced wood can be used.








C - Construction of bench





The whole collection is set on chunky industrial castor wheels.











E - Construction of box



Once finished the furniture needs to be oiled to protect against all weather conditions.





G - Overview of planter






SIDE VIEW


FRONT VIEW

The planters are lined with grow bags to maintain the moisture in the soil and protect the wooden structure.


